## NCJW PRESENTS STUDY GROUP ON ISRAEL AT 70 THROUGH A GENDER LENS

HACKENSACK – Dina B. Charnin, Director of Israel Policy and Programs for National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW Inc.), will speak about *Israel at 70 Through a Gender Lens* at the Bergen County Section's next Study Group on Tuesday, May 1, 2018 at 1 pm. The meeting will take place at the Riverside Mall Conference Center, Lower Level, Hackensack.

National Council of Jewish Women's work empowers Israeli women, advances gender equality, and supports the strengthening of civil liberties, democracy, and peace efforts. Ms. Charnin has extensive experience in Israel over the past 35 years. One of the early leaders of conflict resolution and bridgebuilding work between the Jewish and Arab citizens of Israel, she lived for 2 years in a Muslim Palestinian Israeli town, working for Interns for Peace (IFP), a pioneering grassroots organization dedicated to building cooperative projects between neighboring Jews and Arabs. As Education and Recruitment Director of IFP, and later as Acting Director, she traveled around the U.S. lecturing, fundraising, and recruiting on the topic of Jewish-Arab relations in Israel.

Ms. Charnin continued her Israel-related work as advisor to philanthropist Joy Ungerleider Meyerson of the Dorot Foundation, creating and becoming the founding director of the prestigious Dorot Fellowship in Israel for future Jewish American lay leaders; the one-year fellowship pairs Jewish study with multidimensional experiences of Israel. Charnin has worked for various Jewish foundations and philanthropists, including the Slifka Foundation and the Saul Z. and Amy Scheuer Cohen Family Foundation, where she worked on topics such as environmental justice and religious pluralism in Israel.

She received her BA from Brown University and her MA from the Jewish Theological Seminary. She speaks Hebrew fluently and is conversant in Arabic, French, Spanish and Russian. She was president and board member of Partners for Progressive Israel and has been a leader for 21 years of the Bavli-Yerushalmi study project, a group of Israelis and Americans who learn about each other through the study of ancient and modern Jewish texts. She is also a classically trained flutist playing in chamber ensembles whenever possible.

Charge will be \$5 for members and \$10 for non-members and light refreshments will be served. NCJW BCS provides educational and stimulating programs and speakers throughout the year, including six general meetings and a myriad of study groups, book groups and trips.
