Born in mid-1950s Germany, Dr. Wollschlaeger was raised and educated in Germany. Growing up, he discovered his father, a tank commander and decorated Nazi war hero, had kept the past hidden from his children. Dismayed by the legacy of the Holocaust, the son questioned his father's past, rebelled, converted to Judaism, and immigrated to Israel. He served in the Israel Defense Forces, married a Jewish woman and is currently living in Miami, Florida, with dual Israeli/American citizenship. He is a board certified practicing family physician and addiction specialist, author, speaker, father of three children and a proud Jew. The rift between family and faith never healed. "Our unresolved conflict and my father's denial motivated me to search for answers, and I found them within me and my acquired faith: Against all odds, change is possible."
