

Hannah G. Solomon Award Mitch Schonfeld

This award is named after NCJW's founder who, in 1893, brought together ninety Jewish women from all over the United States to the Parliament of Religions at the Chicago World's Fair. In that year, the first major Jewish women's organization was born. National Council of Jewish Women remains faithful to its founding principles — a dedication to faith and humanity and serving unmet human needs.



Mitch Schonfeld

Mitch Schonfeld is a native of the Bronx and attended the Horace Mann School, graduating in 1973. After receiving a Bachelor of Arts from the State University of NY at Binghamton, he studied early childhood education, teaching the Montessori method for three years. Subsequently, Mr. Schonfeld became a social work professional receiving a Masters Degree in Social Work in 1983 from the Hunter College School of Social Work in NYC. His social work career includes several youth services and youth leadership positions with organizations affiliated with the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies of Greater New York.

In 1992, Mr. Schonfeld became President/CEO of what is now known as the Bergen Family Center, currently located in Englewood. The organization is the oldest continuously-operating family service agency in Bergen County, having been founded in 1898. Services are provided to 5,000 infants, toddlers, children, youth, families, and older adults annually. NCJW Bergen County Section has supported several programs at Bergen Family Center with volunteers and financial aid for many years. These include its popular HIPPY program (Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Children), Adult Senior Center (for visually-impaired adults and other seniors), and its newest endeavor, NCJW BCS/Renee Guller Infant-Toddler Center.

Mr. Schonfeld and his wife are the parents of three children and live in Teaneck. He has several hobbies, including reading, aerobic exercise, gardening, and music.

WOMAN OF THE SECTION AWARD Elaine Pollack

This award was established in 1983 by the Board of Trustees of the then Greater Teaneck Section in honor of its 60th anniversary. The recipient of the award exemplifies the spirit of NCJW – a woman who by deed and action has indicated her commitment to and support and love for this organization, and who has performed outstanding service in one or more of the many facets of the Section.



Elaine Pollack

The Jewish values of Tikkun Olam have always inspired Elaine to utilize her strengths to help and empower those in need. Growing up in Manhattan, she served as a Candy-Striper assisting patients and staff in the local hospital, and she received a BA degree from Hunter College. After getting married and starting her family, she moved to Bergenfield, NJ. For many years Elaine was a stay-at-home mom involved in her children's activities in school and the community. She was also very involved at Temple Emeth, both by serving as a Board Member as well as chairing many committees, such as the Religious School, Special Events,

Membership, and the Renaissance Group. Elaine continues to stay involved in her local temple community by helping to facilitate many special events and to coordinate the accompanying meals and refreshments. As her children matured, Elaine started to work in the local senior citizen buildings managed by the Bergen County Housing Authority. During her twenty-year employment there as a Tenant Coordinator and Building Property Manager, she worked daily to improve the lives of the residents.

In 2005, when Elaine retired, she immediately became active in NCJW. Their emphasis on advocacy and service to those in need matched her interests perfectly. She has served on many committees, chairing the Membership Luncheon, Council Sabbaths, and the Ad Journal. She has also volunteered at the Children's Court Care Center and the Rockleigh Gift Shop. In 2009, Elaine's commitment and dedication was recognized, and she received the Emerging Leader Award. She was elected as Vice President for Administration and Membership, and in 2011-2013 she was elected as Co-President of the Section. In 2015, Elaine was again elected to the

During her free time, Elaine likes to travel and to spend time with her family. She has been happily married for 53 years to her loving husband Joe. She especially enjoys being with her daughter Laura, and son-in-law David and her three marvelous grand-children, Noah, Jacob and Lilly. Presidium's Annual Report

In this, our last year as your Presidium, we discovered unusual new methods of coping when in crisis. But, in spite of the political chaos and the havoc it wreaked in our collective psyches, we were able to achieve our objectives and affirm our commitment to our social justice ideals. We agreed that our successes over the past two years have been noteworthy.

Press coverage was consistent, far reaching, and always beautifully written. Our BCS website was recognized as a wellspring of current information and historical value. Our Facebook page continued to attract new friends on a daily basis. This year's November advocacy forum dedicated to exploring the issues facing the LGBT community met with accolades from our ever-growing list of coalition partners, community leaders, state and county officials, clergy, and the media. Jane Clementi of the Tyler Clementi Foundation and one of our panelists at the November LGBT meeting spoke at our May board meeting about becoming an Upstander, while our last study group focused on the needs and challenges of older members of the LGBT community. Reproductive choice, gun violence and human trafficking were among the other major issues we continued to address.

Beautifully structured General Meetings and Study Groups engaged large numbers of enthusiastic participants eager to be educated, diverted, and/or provoked. Our legislators were made aware of our legitimate concerns and opinions through Action Alerts, via phone calls, emails, well-timed visits, and post-election protest marches in Washington, Trenton, and New York. We urged you to friend us on Facebook, and you were kept informed regularly of progress on important issues through the Bulletin, the Newsletter, our website, and committee reports at our meetings.

You, our volunteers, have given remarkable energy, generous funding, and countless hours to our community service programs in Bergen County. Service organizations, as well as women and children and their families who continued to benefit from your caring, include Bergen Family Center, where HIPPY kids continued to flourish and where you distributed school supplies and holiday gifts. At Youth Consultation Services Holley Center, you provided birthday cakes for the children. You staffed the Children's Court Care Center, where you interacted with and supervised children while their parents attended court, you maintained and staffed the domestic violence waiting room at the Hackensack Court House and provided services at the Women's Rights Information Center and at the Center for Hope and Safety.

You continued to prepare and provide food for the homeless as well as therapeutic exercise for our Swim-In clients. Other tangible results of our programs extended to the Center for Food Action children,

for whom you provided weekend snack packs, to Bergen Family Center Adult Senior Center where you offered monthly birthday parties for seniors and to the Jewish Home at Rockleigh where you offered companionship and parties for seniors. Our Community Services continue to thrive today because of your unwavering commitment.

Essential to any nonprofit so heavily invested in social justice in its community is its funding. And, as usual, we looked to you during the year for your commitment to our philanthropic goals. Fortunately, you all supported us by your active involvement in the Game Day luncheon. The New Jersey Symphony Series, always a favorite, attracted a good number of new donor participants.

The most significant and always the most successful segment of our fundraising efforts, "Stay-At-Home," continued to be the "jewel in our crown." Today, during this terrifying period of uncertainty, the most vulnerable in our community will most surely be in jeopardy and in need of our assistance. As grants vanish and assistance programs disappear, BCS must be able to continue to supply our financial support whenever and wherever we are needed. And we will look to you, our volunteers, who understand the needs of the disenfranchised.

The Thrift Shop was and remains a mainstay of our philanthropy. We extend to all our sincere thanks for your generous and constant donations of jewelry, gently-used clothing, bric-a-brac, and books. We applaud you, our always faithful volunteers, who served our clients with such charm and grace.

And thanks to those unsung heroes who did all the writing, editing and proofreading, planned the trips, chaired our Standing Committees, recruited and involved new members and worked behind the scenes in a myriad of ways.

At this writing, and yet to come, is the grand finale: Installation in June at Temple Emanu-El in Closter. We promise you an outstanding brunch and an opportunity to fete our honorees: Woman of the Section Elaine Pollack and the Hannah G. Solomon recipient Mitch Schonfeld, CEO of Bergen Family Center.

This Presidium wishes to express its gratitude to all who contributed to the successes of this past year: Our Vice-Presidents, Executive Committee, the Board of Directors, and the multitude of volunteers and donors.

So, now we pass the gavel to the three extraordinary women who will lead our section for the coming year. Elizabeth, Jane, and Ruth, we wish you good health, patience, strength, courage, and an abundance of successes.

ADVOCACY

Advocacy is about action. As part of the democratic practice, NCJW BCS speaks out on important issues to federal, state and local officials, as a group and individually, with emails, phone calls and petitions. Currently our section's issues focus on gun violence, immigration, human trafficking, income inequality, voting rights, women's health/reproductive justice, and LGBT rights. EDUCATION

With seven general meetings and a myriad of study groups, including a Lunch & Learn, throughout the year, NCJW BCS provides educational and stimulating programs and speakers. Monthly book groups are opportunities for thoughtful discussions on new and classic literature. Trips and guided tours of a variety of historic and cultural attractions are arranged in and around NJ and NY.

PHILANTHROPY

Funds are raised from generous NCJW BCS members and from others in the community who share similar values. The section sponsors special events and provides creative individual and corporate giving opportunities.

THRIFT SHOP

NCJW BCS Thrift Shop is located at 75 South Washington Avenue in Bergenfield. Proceeds from the sale of donated gently-used clothes, accessories and household items go directly to support those in need in the community and provide gift cards to some clients of our community services.

WEBSITE AND FACEBOOK

NCJW BCS's website is updated daily, as a real-time resource for news and information about our section's myriad of programs, events, community service activities, volunteer opportunities, advocacy initiatives, research tools, enrichment programs and much more. SOCIAL ACTION IN ISRAEL

NCJW's work in Israel is rooted in a commitment to advancing women's status and rights by helping them develop a stronger voice on all levels of Israeli society. Our work supports at-risk populations, with a special emphasis on children. Bergen County Section participates annually in the NCJW Israeli Granting Program.

Community Services and Coalition Partners

ADLER APHASIA CENTER is a place where people touched by aphasia, the loss of power to use words, can comfortably communicate.

BERGEN FAMILY CENTER HOME INSTRUCTION FOR PARENTS OF PRESCHOOL YOUNGSTERS

(HIPPY) trains parents to be their children's first teachers. Co-sponsored by Bergen Family Center, monthly workshops are enjoyed by parents and their children.

BERGEN FAMILY CENTER ADULT SENIOR

CENTER is a unique social day care program for seniors and visually-impaired adults.

BERGEN VOLUNTEER MEDICAL INITIATIVE

(BVMI), staffed by volunteer medical professionals, provides free primary medical care to low-income Bergen County working residents who have neither medical insurance nor the means to pay for care.

CENTER FOR FOOD ACTION (CFA) provides emergency food, rent, and utility assistance to those in need in Bergen County.

CENTER FOR HOPE AND SAFETY assists women and children who are victims of domestic violence with emergency housing, counseling and support services.

CHILDREN'S COURT CARE CENTER (CCCC) is a supervised play area within the Bergen County Court House for children of litigants involved in court proceedings.

FAMILY PROMISE WALK-IN DINNER PROGRAM

prepares and serves meals in a kitchen/dining center for people in need in Bergen County.

JEWISH HOME AT ROCKLEIGH is a comprehensive skilled nursing and geriatric facility offering the latest in

technological advances and an array of amenities in a caring environment.

KNIT WITS knit hats, scarves and afghans for seniors, children, hospital patients, the homeless and victims of disasters.

PROJECT S.A.R.A.H. is a statewide project that provides domestic violence and sexual abuse counseling and treatment, as well as community education on awareness and prevention with unique emphasis to the Orthodox lewish community.

SUMMER CAMPERSHIP is a unique, public-private fund that gives children of working parents the opportunity to attend summer camp.

SWIM-IN, co-sponsored by the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, is a therapeutic water exercise program for people with MS.

WAITING ROOM provides a safe, welcoming haven at the Bergen County Courthouse for domestic violence litigants while awaiting court appearances.

WOMEN'S RIGHTS INFORMATION CENTER/ SHARED HOUSING (WRIC) offers job training and placement services as well as housing alternatives for singleparent families.

YOUTH CONSULTATION SERVICE HOLLEY CHILD CARE & DEVELOPMENT CENTER is

a residential treatment facility for emotionally and/or physically abused children in crisis.

YOUTH CONSULTATION SERVICE KILBARCHAN

is a residential treatment home for adolescents offering a safe environment to meet each teen's developmental needs.

Hungry families would not receive needed food or help with utilities —

Women and men with multiple sclerosis would not have the opportunity to spend needed physical therapy time in the water nor have the chance to socialize with others with similar problems —

Hungry adults would not receive warm chicken dinners —

There would be no funds to support community services in Bergen County and in Israel — The public would not learn about NCJW and its many activities.

These are but a few instances of the many ways you, our volunteers, play a vital and deeply appreciated role in improving the quality of life for women, children and families in our community. Your involvement in so many ways means a great deal to scores of our fellow citizens. We all owe you a huge and heartfelt "thank you" for all you do.




