## COMING EVENTS

### MAY GENERAL MEETING GROUNDBREAKING ADVOCATE, INSPIRING ROLE MODEL

Elizabeth Holtzman has had an outstanding career serving the citizens of the United States while being a role model for all women. Her keen sense of duty along with her brilliant mind led her to places women had not gone before. A graduate of Radcliffe College and Harvard Law School, Ms. Holtzman was elected to Congress in 1973 to represent the 16th Congressional District of New York where she served for four terms. At that time she was the youngest woman ever elected to the U.S. Congress.

Ms. Holtzman served on the House Judiciary Committee during the Nixon impeachment proceedings, chaired the Refugee subcommittee and spearheaded efforts to bring Nazi war criminals to justice in the United States. After her stint in Congress, Ms. Holtzman was elected Brooklyn District Attorney in 1985 and in 1989 was the first woman elected to be Comptroller of New York City. In 1999 President Clinton appointed her to the agency overseeing the declassification of 8 million pages of secret Nazi war crimes. In 2013 U.S. Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel appointed her to a panel that examined the handling of sexual assaults in the military. Ms. Holtzman is currently a practicing attorney and author, writing about politics in this era of political turmoil.

On March 13 Jane Abraham, our Co-President, passed away. This is the first time in our section's history that a sitting president has passed on.

Jane was a wonderful woman who was loved, is missed and will always be cherished. Our Jane was an amazing wife, mother, grandmother, Co-President and dear friend.

After retiring from a career at the UJA Federation, Jane became an active member in the Bergen County Section of NCJW with a special interest in advocacy.

It was apparent from the first time the Board met her that her energy, passion and high degree of integrity marked her for an executive position. She didn't expect it would happen within the first two years of becoming active in NCJW BCS, but her sharp intelligence and consistent calm under pressure were exactly what the Section needed. In 2017, the three of us were elected Co-Presidents. We quickly became a threesome. It was a steep learning curve to become Co-Presidents after such a short time in the organization, but we learned together and had fun doing it. We quickly became fast friends and almost part of the furniture at Matthews Diner in Bergenfield, where we had long meetings that lasted well after our waitress left for the day.

The three of us had new grandchildren a month apart and, to be honest, one of the reasons our meetings lasted so long was that we didn't start talking about NCJW until we had shared the latest photos and brought each other up to date on our children's and grandchildren's latest accomplishments.

As we built our BCS platform, Jane's focus on the less fortunate was a powerful voice that shepherded our advocacy work. She understood that advocacy meant turning passion into action, and she passed that concept on to the Executive Committee, Board and members. No advocacy meeting was too far away, too late or too early. She promoted the right to vote, understood the need for immigration reform, marched for reproductive choice, spoke out for the LGBTQ community and against human trafficking and was always mindful of the

problems facing our aging population and those suffering from poverty, hunger and domestic violence.

She was courageous both personally and professionally, and we were not deceived by her slight stature. She was actually quite tenacious. In recent months we admired Jane more than we can say for her courage, positive attitude and dignity in dealing with her illness. She made light of her situation. She insisted on coming to all the meetings she could manage because, she said, "I LOVE doing this." She continued to answer emails about NCJW until two days before she died, and only in the very last message did she say she wasn't feeling well.

Jane's kindness, understanding and wonderful sense of humor made working with her easy and rewarding. We'll miss her smile and her encouragement, and mostly her friendship.

May her life be for a blessing. We dedicate this issue of the bulletin to her memory.

Ms. Rivera not only sees patients, but she also orders tests, reads results and makes diagnoses, all of which help BVMI streamline its use of its facilities and practitioners. Ms. Rivera explains, "BVMI is not like any other clinic. It's very patient-centered. Patients get one-on-one attention."

### EXPERIENCE JEWISH HISTORY, A TASTE OF SPAIN AND POP CULTURE . . .

On **Tuesday, June 18**, our **NCJW trip** will begin with a guided tour of the historic Congregation Ahavas Sholom, **Newark's oldest operating synagogue** and the last remaining synagogue born from the Great Migration of European Jews at the turn of the 20th century. We will proceed to Casa Vasca, a Spanish restaurant, for a three course, family-style lunch. The menu will include three appetizers, three main dishes (veal, chicken and fish) served with potatoes and rice, sangria and soda, a choice of desserts, and coffee, tea or cappuccino.
