

Virtual Trip to Manhattan's Tenement Museum

Tuesday, December 1, 2020 1:00 - 2:30 pm



Please join us for NCJW's exciting, first virtual trip to Manhattan's famous lower east side Tenement Museum and enjoy a customized, live tour offering insights into immigrant life in the U.S. at the turn of the 20th century.

Entitled *Chamber Pots and Handkerchiefs* and led by Museum historians, the tour will focus on health issues of the period and will relate the immigrant experience to today's modern health care concerns. You will enter the apartment of an actual turn of the twentieth century tenant and through her, learn how women dealt with illness

and life and acted as agents of change in the late 19th and early 20th century. Following the one hour interactive tour, there will be a 30 minute Q & A, with additional opportunity for our group to ask specific questions on life and health issues of the era.

Due to space constraints within the museum, this trip could not have been offered to an in-person group of this size, and so the virtual experience presents a unique opportunity. Attendance is limited to 50.
